
**THE LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK (AYLESBURY ESTATE SITE 1B-1C) COMPULSORY PURCHASE ORDER 2014**

I am writing to inform you that the Aylesbury Leaseholder Action Group ("ALAG") hereby withdraws its objection to the above Compulsory Purchase Order. The circumstances of the withdrawal of the objection are as follows:

1. The London Borough of Southwark ("the Council") undertook to review its rehousing policies in relation to leaseholders affected by regeneration in its area.
2. By a report dated the 16 March 2018 it set out a range of amendments to its rehousing offer; and those amendments included a mechanism whereby leaseholders could own 100% of a replacement property (subject to a charge).
3. Following that process, the ALAG participated in a mediation between it and the Council.
4. An agreement was reached within that mediation, the details of which are confidential between the parties.
5. On the basis of that agreement, which included a commitment to rehouse the remaining leaseholders on the revised arrangements, the ALAG was able to withdraw its objection.

6. For the avoidance of doubt, please note that the ALAG no longer relies upon any of the following:
  - a. The ALAG Statement of Case (original or amended) for the 2018 inquiry
  - b. The ALAG Opening Submissions to the 2018 inquiry
  - c. The ALAG Oral evidence to the 2018 inquiry
  - d. The ALAG written evidence to the 2018 inquiry
  
7. A schedule of the ALAG submitted material (which is hereby withdrawn) is attached to this letter.
  
8. A Statement of Common Ground is also attached, which is signed by both parties.
